### **Lead Belayer Good Practice Refresher Sessions**

These will be held at the start of every competition and all volunteer belayers MUST attend.

#### Key points covered:

- Basics (Equipment/positioning/feeding/lowering)
- Holding falls (positioning/responding/lowering)
- Slack in the system (management/responding)
- Back clipping (Understanding/Climbers to be notified and given the opportunity to correct it)
- Z clipping (Understanding/Climbers to be notified)
- Missing Clips (Climbers to be notified)

### Competition Rules to note:

- Prior to the start of each attempt on a lead climb, the rope can be clipped through the first or second protection point (quickdraw) if deemed appropriate by the Lead/Head route-setter.
  - The Chief Judge shall, in consultation with the Forerunner, decide whether additional security is required in the form of:
  - a) Clipping the second protection point (quickdraw) on a route.
  - b) In exceptional circumstances, clipping the third protection point (quickdraw) on a route.
