There are four regional rounds; two roped and two boulder. Each round consists of eight separate events taking place simultaneously across eight different regions in England and Wales. The series will culminate in a two-day Grand Final where the top three in each category from each BMC region, and from Scotland and Ireland, are invited to take part.

At the end of the last regional round, each competitor's Series score shall be the aggregate of their three best ranking results in the Series. The top three competitors in each category in each region at the end of the regional Series will qualify to enter the Grand Final. Youth E are not eligible to attend the Grand Final

- Eligibility for the Grand Final
- Clarification on some of the rules that were unclear



## Scoring....

• A version of the Olympic Combined scoring

### Why?

- Easier to understand
- Entry level competition, will allow all competitors to achieve a score
- It is already a combined event and now there is a scoring system for it

Zone 2 hold

1st attempt: 10

2<sup>nd</sup> attempt: 9.9

3rd attempt: 9.8

4th attempt: 9.7

5th attempt: 9.6

Controlled the second Zone Hold but not the Top Hold (regardless of whether the first Zone Hold has been Controlled on any attempt)

Start position







### Top hold

1st attempt: 25

2<sup>nd</sup> attempt: 24.9

3<sup>rd</sup> attempt: 24.8

4<sup>th</sup> attempt: 24.7 5<sup>th</sup> attempt: 24.6

Controlled the Top Hold with both hands (regardless of whether the competitor has Controlled any Zone Hold on the boulder)





Zone 1 hold

1st attempt: 5

2<sup>nd</sup> attempt: 4.9

3<sup>rd</sup> attempt: 4.8

4th attempt: 4.7

5th attempt: 4.6

Controlled the first Zone Hold


A hold shall be considered as "Controlled" where a competitor has made use of the hold to achieve a stable or controlled position.

Controlled Z1 hold on fifth attempt only

Controlled Z2 hold on 1st attempt

Did NOT control Z1 or Z2 holds or reach the Top on all of five attempts

Top on 1st attempt

Controlled Z1 hold on 1<sup>st</sup> attempt and all four subsequent attempts

Controlled Z2 hold on 2<sup>nd</sup> attempt
Did not use all attempts (therefore no initials)

#### JUDGES: PLEASE RECORD ATTEMPTS CLEARLY

In Judge's attempt records columns, use ONLY the following marks;

- Attempt only (zone 1, zone 2 and top not achieved on this attempt)
- **4** Zone 1 achieved (zone 2 and top not achieved on this attempt)
- **‡** Zone 2 achieved (even if zone 1 was not achieved on this attempt)
- **F** Top achieved (even if neither zone was achieved on this attempt)

A competitor's final score at a Boulder round is the sum of their highest scoring attempts on each boulder.



Top-rope Scoring

#### Hold

48 points when controlled with one hand

48.1 points when used

#### Hold

46 points when controlled with one hand

47.1 points when used

A competitor's final score at a Top-rope round is the sum of their scores achieved on each route.

Sequence continues down to the first handhold



#### Last hold

**49** points when **controlled** with one hand **TOP** (50 points) when **controlled** with both hands

#### Hold

47 points when controlled with one hand

47.1 points when used

A hold shall be considered as "**Controlled**" where a competitor has made use of the hold to achieve a stable or controlled position.

A hold from which a competitor has made a Controlled climbing movement in the interest of progressing along the route shall be considered as "**Used**".

**Lead Scoring** 

#### Hold

48 points when controlled with one hand

48.1 points when used

#### Hold

46 points when controlled with one hand

47.1 points when used

A competitor's final score at a Lead round is the sum of their scores achieved on each route.

Sequence continues down to the first handhold



#### Last hold

**49** points when **controlled** with one hand **TOP** (50 points) when **lower-off karabiner is clipped** from any legitimate position

47 points when controlled with one hand

47.1 points when used

A hold shall be considered as "**Controlled**" where a competitor has made use of the hold to achieve a stable or controlled position.

A hold from which a competitor has made a Controlled climbing movement in the interest of progressing along the route shall be considered as "**Used**".

# Youth Climbing Series 2024 Series ranking



At the end of a round, each competitor's rank position in that round is converted to Series ranking points as shown in the table below:

1 <sup>st</sup>	100 pts	11 <sup>th</sup>	31 pts	21 <sup>st</sup>	10 pts
2 <sup>nd</sup>	80 pts		28 pts		9 pts

Note: Competitors finishing in 31<sup>st</sup> position and lower receive zero (0) ranking points.

Where competitors are tied in a category, each will be awarded the average of ranking points shared by the tied group.

### **Example 1**

If three competitors are tied in third place they are 'occupying' third, fourth and fifth places which would be a total of

65 + 55 + 51 = 171 ranking points so each competitor would be awarded

$$\frac{171}{3} = 57 \text{ points}$$

### **Example 2**

If two competitors are tied in second place, they would each be awarded:

$$\frac{80+65}{2} = \frac{145}{2} = 72.5$$
 points

At any time during the YCS, a competitor's Series ranking is the sum total of the best three Series ranking points awarded to that competitor so far.
